## Dependency on Christ!

"I'm in the same place spiritually as I was 20 years ago." That's the comment made to me by a man who was reflecting on his life over coffee one day. I have come to find out that this seems to be a common trait among us men. Especially men who, like me, are nearing the half way point in their lives. If you think about it, it makes sense. Everything in our lives seems to be growing around us, including our age. Responsibilities at home and work, size of our house, income, frequent flyer points, commitments (financial and time), acquaintances, complexity of homework, even the number of children. As you can see, it's easy for God to get lost in the shuffle. Just like the man above, if we don't stop to reflect, then we won't even notice. I am grateful to say that this man and I are meeting every other week to help grow his relationship with the Lord.

One of the focuses with Men Abiding in Christ Ministries is to be intentional about becoming more dependent on God and less dependent on ourselves. In his book No Man Left Behind, Pat Morley states that the fundamental struggle with men is ....

Every moment of every day we choose either to live out of our own strength and be independent from God, or to depend on God alone and walk by faith. When we try to be independent, we sin. When we walk by faith, Christ's righteousness is lived out in obedience. The system of this world is almost perfectly designed to encourage our men to rely on their own strength.

This is true in my own life and very true in many of the men who I spend time with. Men in church struggle with the same issues which is why I spend so much time with the men's leadership team in churches emphasizing the importance of discipleship. I help leadership teams view everything that touches men in their church as an opportunity for God to reveal himself in a new way therefore, in many cases, creating a desire to know him better. I am finding that most of us believe in God and want this all powerful and loving Creator to be a part of our day to day walk. My passion is helping this become a reality.
