Building Awareness

Building one's awareness of God is a major focus for MAC Ministries. It's part of the method that I commonly use in helping someone position their lives to respond to the invitation to "abide" in Christ. Much of my time spent with others is used to position others to become aware of their need for Christ which usually starts with just building awareness.

Recently, I had a conversation with someone who for the past few months have been meeting with. It was a great reminder of how God uses MAC Ministries. This man can attest that building his awareness of Christ, has allowed him to see a change in his inner driver (or heart).

Our conversation went something like this: "Pat, I keep wondering how long it will take until I get to the next level in my walk with the Lord?" My response came out before I could articulate an answer... "You're already there."

"I appreciate your encouragement, and I know that you've said this before, but I'm not seeing the results that I'm looking for yet." I replied, "Look inward for the results. You have a changed driver that I can see clearly."

Our conversation reminds me of something I read from one of my favorite authors, Watchman Nee. He shared that many of us are constantly praying to enter that room that is occupied by the Lord when in fact we're already in the room.

This is a common thought pattern with many men that I spend time with. This gentleman made an intentional decision to seek me out because he wanted to grow in his faith but did not know how to take that next step. What resulted was a commitment to meet weekly and spend time looking at Scripture and other readings to ultimately help him "know" the Lord better... not just "know about" the Lord.

To help explain what I see, I asked more questions to help him reflect on his journey over the past year. For example, I asked him

Mexico Update by Pat MacPherson

Back in September, I had the joy of taking 22 people to Monterrey, Mexico to host a soccer camp for 5-11 year olds in the community of Renacimiento. Not only was it the largest group of folks that has ever gone with me to Renacimiento, but it was also the first time that a group of middle school and high school aged youth joined us... eight in all, including three of my own.

It was one of the most exciting trips in the past 6 years because of the energy of our youth and the anticipation of those (16!) who had never been to Renacimiento before.

Having my three children, Mary (12), James (13), and Liam (16) on this visit allowed

them to encounter the wonderful people of Renacimiento and enjoy the blessing of connecting with the people I have known for years. Several of the kids in Renacimiento immediately started asking James and Liam about hockey because I have been showing pictures of my family to them over the years. Amazingly, it took about 15 minutes for my children to quickly bond and engage with the other kids.

To give you a sense of the trip through the eyes of the youth, I asked my 3 kids to reflect on why they thought God had them go to Renacimiento. I'm excited to share their thoughts.

From Mary:

Since I was six years old, my dad has been going to Mexico. I would always see pictures of him from his travels and I'd always wonder what it was like to go there. So, in September, I finally got to go and it was an amazing experience.

From the moment I arrived, I knew that God had put me there for a reason.

Immediately, I had a special connection with many of the children. When we would go out on the soccer field, there would always be a few kids sitting on the side of the field, just watching. Since, I'm not a soccer player, I decided to start hanging out with these kids. That's when I met Yesi, who approached me with an American football and motioned that she wanted to play catch.

Yesi and I became fast buddies. Although Yesi did not speak English (nor I Spanish), we quickly connected and over the next two days became close friends. I came to understand, what my dad has been telling me about relationships, that they are a gift from God. And Yesi was a gift from God for me and I'm eager to see her again when I

return. I am also aware that God may keep Yesi and I friends for a long time and possibly eternally.

From James:

God brought me down to Renacimiento to start relationships that will hopefully last a lifetime. As soon as I arrived, I realized this wasn't going to be a one-time trip. The unconditional love that the people at Casa Samuel showed me was truly incredible.

One of the reasons we went there was to bring joy to them, but I felt like they gave me more joy than I gave them. Especially through my friend Jair who I had been pen pals with since second grade. In September, I finally got to meet Jair face-to-face. It was such a blessing to meet him and we quickly became friends. I experienced joy and peace during those days with Jair that only our powerful God can bring us.

From Liam:

Going to Mexico helped me gain a better perspective towards life. The people that we met, have very little in comparison to what most of us Americans however they remain joyful because of their strong faith in God.

Also, Pastor Eva reminds me of a Bible story where a woman is giving a small tithe compared to the larger tithing amounts given by the men in the church. Then Jesus shares that she is giving much more than all the others because she is giving all that she has and not giving from the overflow. Pastor Eva, who does not come from a wealthy background, devotes her whole life to the people of Renacimiento because God has put it on her heart to do so. We need more Pastor Eva's in this world!

Pat invited me to participate in a bible study in the early spring of 2016 and have been attending weekly since then.
